It seems to Gary that the sewer line activity is causing his traps to dry up, allowing sewer gas to come back into the home. He has had his ventilation checked by a local plumber and all seems in order there. Mayor Moen has discussed the issue with the Water and Sewer department and as the sewer line that is being discussed is a gravity line it is unclear how it would be able to build up suction to cause the problem. The Water and Waste Water Superintendent will be asked to contact Gary directly and work through the issue.

Calendars for June & July were reviewed and discussed.

The Council wishes to congratulate the High School Baseball Team in the State Championship and requested that Mayor Moen publish a proclamation.

Blight Reports have been coming into the Auditor's Office and notices have begun being sent out to cover over grown lawn, weeds, bushes and trees as well as abandoned and junk vehicles and other ordinance violations. Prompt attention to the notices and cleanup within the stated times is urged as city Crews will begin taking care of the issues and bills will be sent to owners.

NDDOT is preparing to chip seal highway 200 through Mayville. We do not have dates yet.

During the law enforcement report Deputy Cote explained that there are some ATV's that are street legal and can be operated on streets by those holding valid licenses. They have been on the lookout for those not legal to issue citations.

O'Brien moved to approve the Second reading of the Century Link franchise ordinance:

ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by City Council of the City of Mayville, North Dakota:

Section 1. That Owest Corporation dba CenturyLink QC, its successors and assigns (collectively "Grantee"), are hereby granted the right to use and occupy the streets, alleys, public ways and other public places as now or hereafter constituted of the City of Mayville, North Dakota, for a term of twenty (20) years from the effective date hereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating a telecommunications and broadband services system within, over, upon and under the streets, alleys, public ways and other public places of said City.

Section 2. That the rights herein granted are subject to Chapter XI, Franchises, of the ordinances of the City of Mayville and the lawful exercise of the police power as the same now is or may hereafter be conferred upon said city.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect, and shall constitute a binding contract between the City of Mayville and Qwest Corporation dba CenturyLink QC when it shall have been enacted according to law, and when the provisions hereof shall have been accepted in writing by said Qwest Corporation dba CenturyLink QC and such acceptance filed with the City Auditor.

Section 4. During the construction, maintenance or enlargement of any part of said telecommunications system, said Grantee shall not unnecessarily impede or block travel in said streets and highways in said City and shall leave all streets, highways, alleys, sidewalks, curbs, lanes and public places and all grounds disturbed by said construction in good condition upon the completion of said

The City reserves the right to make and adopt, and the rights and privileges hereby granted shall at all times be and remain subject to such reasonable regulations of a police nature as it may deem necessary for the best interests of the City, provided that such regulations shall not be in conflict with this franchise or with the laws of the State of North Dakota or the United States and provided that the City will not by any such regulations or by acts of its own or agents do anything to prevent or interfere with the Grantee carrying on its business in accordance with the franchise hereby granted.

Section 5. In case of disturbance of any street, sidewalk, alley, public way, or paved area, the Grantee shall, at its own cost and expense and in manner approved by the City or its Engineer, replace and restore such street, sidewalk, alley, public way, or paved areas in as good a condition as before the work involving such disturbance was done. Grantee shall not be required to pay a fee for street openings.
