Petersen moved to pay the bills, a second by Meshefski-LaBine supported the motion, motion carried.

Calendars for July and August were reviewed and discussed.

ND League of Cities to hold Legislative briefings. The schedule was included with the closest meeting being Grand Forks on July 9th.

There is a new booklet from ND Water Systems available in the Auditor's office. This is an initial overview on ND water systems.

The Mayor and Council congratulated the Mayport Community Club on a Great Summerfest! The Mayor to do a proclamation for printing in the Tribune.

The Auditor's Office has an updated copy of "Where your taxes go". The document contains information on year over year mill levy, city, county, and school district as well as value per mill for commercial and residential.

The heating/cooling system at the Armory had a failed circulating pump, this was replaced.

The Trailer Court has hired a company based in Fargo to work with them in getting the Fire Hydrants in working order and maintained on an ongoing basis. The cleanup for the trailer fire is underway.

A thank you was received from Janet Meyer & Family for the memorial plant for her father.

It is 2016 budget time; please get requests and quotes into the Auditor.

Carlson made a motion to approve the recommendation from both the Physical Plant committee and the Administrative Committee to excuse \$5,200 of the leak this past winter at the Trailer Court. The city has some responsibility when we had our software vendor look at the issue and they felt it was an error from being setup incorrectly in the software. Petersen seconded it and upon a roll call vote the following voted: Yea: Carlson, Meshefski-LaBine, Petersen; Nay: 0; Absent: Petersen, O'Brien, Bohnsack.

The Council reviewed two proposals from Moore Engineering; one to look into drainage issues at Riverwood and one to look into issues with pooling water in the alley: 7th and 8th Ave SE from 1st St to 3rd St SE. Questions on the original plan for Riverwood and what do they expect to be different this time in looking at the alley were raised, with the Auditor directed to contact the engineers for follow-up at the next month's committee meeting.
